I would like to discuss with you my concerns:

- 1) It is well known that a lot of mothers are not sending the children to their father and they are challenging it in the courts even after an agreement is being made, and they are both living in the same state.
- 2) As you know my wife Esther has not sent me the children for months, and even asked the court to prevent me from seeing my children, she understands that the children don't need their father, as proven again at the meeting May 5th, therefore how can I trust her that she will send me the children when they are in a different country?
- 3) My two sons, (especially the older) are protesting against going to Montreal even after they were there for the holiday, he claims he wants to go to shul with me, and he wants me to study with him, they don't want to leave their school they are settled in and happy with, and they need my support and encouragement, what they don't get from her.
- 4) If I allow her to take the children to Montreal, and she PROMISES to send them to me, the only thing I am left with is a PROMISE, but if the children stay here I am left with them.
- 5) As of now the children are still here, and the matter is still in court, it is much easier and cheaper to deal with it now, then to start a new case in a foreign country.
- 6) It is not in my interest to take away the custody from my wife, but it is in my interest to protect my children and myself.

Due to all the above, I ask you, to explain before the court, that either she stays here and she has custody, or she leaves to Montreal and I get custody.
